## **Class Procedures**

Classwork:	Any class work not completed in class must be completed as homework and turn by time I grade work (assignments graded weekly.)
Late Work	Each school day the assignment is late there is a 10% point deduction up to the 5 <sup>th</sup> day then the student will receive a 20%. When Student turns in Late Work, He/She MUST EMAIL TEACHER AND PARENT or it WILL NOT BE GRADED.

Quizzes:	Quizzes will be both announced and unannounced. If you are absent for a quiz, it is your responsibility to make up the quiz before school or after school and arrange transport home. Quizzes must be made up before a test is given over the material otherwise, a zero will be recorded for that quiz.
Testing Policy:	There will be 2 or 3 tests during the 9 weeks. Corrections can be offered after each test based on the discretion of Mr. D. Any kind of cheating during the test will be graded 0 (zero) and I will notify administrator and your parents. Students are not allowed to talk during the testing time. If you finish your test, put your test face down and stay quiet and wait for the next assignment.
Projects	There will be at least one project every Chapter from Text. The project will count for 25 % of your grade.
	There will also be 2 Larger Projects, one each semester, 1 will be a semester long project, Mr. D. Will provide more information when it is time for that.
Participation	Participation: is based on positive contributions to classroom activities. This includes appropriate questions, comments, participation in class discussion and assignments. Students may lose participation credit because of disruptive behavior, tardiness, inattentiveness, dismissal from class, incomplete assignments, and other negative behaviors.
Notebook	Students will keep their materials organized and available for later reference. All students are <b>required</b> to keep homework assignments, graded papers, handouts, maps, class notes, and other materials in their Interactive Online Journals. Students journals will be graded once a week; those assignments that will be graded will be noted on our daily slides with each weeks agenda and Objectives for the day. <u>You</u> must keep your information up to date to receive full credit.
	The Syllabus and classroom rules should be the first items in your warmup area (copy will be provided through Google Classrooms and online.)
Absences	When a student returns from being absent he/she needs to check Google Classrooms for any handouts and assignments. The student can get notes from his or her friends or see me after school.

- Make-up WorkStudents will have the number of days you missed to turn in the late work.<br/>Example: If you the student was absent on a Tuesday and returns on a<br/>Wednesday they have until Thursday to turn the assignment in for full<br/>credit.
- **Need Help???** I am available for tutoring before school on Tuesday and Thursday. The schedule is posted by my classroom door. Please take advantage of any help that is offered. It is important that you spend the time you need to be successful.
- CheatingCHEATING will not be tolerated. Students must complete their own<br/>work. CHEATING is considered copying assignments, sharing information<br/>about exams, communication during exams and quizzes or wandering eyes.<br/>If student is caught cheating then he/she will have to copy the chapter that<br/>we are discussing in class. PLAGIARISM is defined as a piece of writing<br/>that has been copied from someone else including printed material and<br/>online sources and is presented as being your own work. It will not be<br/>tolerated and a grade of ZERO will be given on the assignment.
- **HELPFUL HINTS READ!** Reading assignments are not optional. In History, they are essential to understanding the context of what we are studying. Skimming the material to complete assignments is not the same as reading, and does not provide the conceptual and factual understanding necessary to academic success. All students can comprehend assigned reading; therefore we do not spend class time simply "going over" assigned reading.
  - **REVIEW CLASS NOTES DAILY:** Fill in any gaps in your notes where the information is not clear. (Yes, lecture material will also be on every exam.) Come to see me if you are unable to complete your notes or homework assignment. It usually only takes a few moments to answer your questions.
  - DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE END OF THE SEMESTER REPORTING PERIOD TO WORRY ABOUT GRADES. The time to be concerned about your grade is right now.

There are **TWO** (2) things you need to do to be **SUCCESSFUL** in my class. First, is to follow the posted rules. Secondly, put effort into everything you do.
